

# CANON JACKSON RETIRES

Canon Jackson gave his final Sunday service at St Mary's in Birchanger on July 4<sup>th</sup>, after performing as a relief Priest for the past six and a half years.

Derek Jackson was ordained at Southwell Minster Nottinghamshire in 1953 and has ministered to congregations in locations as varied as Cerne Abbas in Dorset to Ibiza and Bermuda. He is best known for his time at St in Bishop Stortford between 1974 and 1985 at St Michael's.




Canon Jackson in The Editor's garden

During his final service he spoke about the variety of places and Church communities he has served and about his long association with the Delhi Brotherhood and the Gurkha Welfare Trust, that began when he served as a Captain in the 4th Gurkha rifles. He paid tribute to the warm reception he has enjoyed in our village and reported the outcome of an appeal made on his behalf by Joy Wright to mark his final retirement. A total of over £2500 was raised and a cheque was presented to him at a dinner held at The Stansted Manor

Hotel on 25<sup>th</sup> June.

As he was speaking Caroline Currer, who will become an assistant Curate in the Benefice was being ordained at Chelmsford. She is expected to begin taking services in Birchanger during August. We look forward to seeing her in and around the village.

We wish Derek and his wife Janet a long, relaxing retirement, it is very well deserved!



# Apathy rules OK!

Birchanger is changing, this summer the difference in attitude from one segment of the population, (those who join in and take part in the community based aspects of village) and those who live here, come and go but are happy to ignore whatever is going on and everyone else and has become more marked.

Then the Canon's final service in the village was attended by a congregation of over sixty just to say farewell.

# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS FROM Elizabeth Godwin

#### Rochford's.

The emerging local plan shows Rochford's Nursery Site to be designated to have 720 new dwellings. The upward increase is directly due to pressure to accommodate more houses in the South East by the Office of The Deputy Prime Minister and will be a hard one to fight.

The concern is that as two acres of the site are to be saved for Greater Crested Newts. The rest of the site will have to find more space for the larger numbers and that will only be at the expense of the internal open spaces, and play areas. Densities will have to be increased and this could lead to the creation of three storey units, and a far more urban style, than what was originally proposed. There are also traffic implications and there should be a further traffic survey, due to other population increases and the change in traffic flow patterns when the new A120 is fully open.

The amended Local Plan goes out for public consultation shortly and your own individual opinions really do matter. If the numbers, traffic, or any other matters concern you, then you must write giving your own views to the District Council. Each representation does count.

### House prices in Birchanger.

If you are selling or planning to sell your house, or have had recent valuations done upon your property, I would like to hear from you. This will of course, be in confidence. Stansted Airport claims that house prices in the CM23 5 post code area have risen by 25% in the past two years. So far there is no evidence of this in Birchanger.

I need more positive proof if I am to try to secure any compensation for any home in Birchanger. For this I need actual evidence from valuations two years ago, and from now onwards. There is no guarantee that there will be a positive result, but we believe that we are suffering from blight, and we must prove it, before we can make a claim.

#### Essex Ambulance Service.

We are all familiar with the Paramedics who operate from Birchanger Lane. Many of us are grateful for their prompt assistance.

The Essex Ambulance Service has just been given an award for its paramedics scheme, which includes the Paramedics Service, and First Responders. The response time within 8 minutes is above 70%, which given the rural aspect of much of Essex is very good.

## An apology.

The hedge around the recreation ground was cut late this year. The contractors arrived for the regular cut, but discovered several birds nesting in the hedge. They were reluctant to disturb them, and will definitely be back when the birds have flown!

## Dumpers are back in Digby Wood again!

We use the path through Digby Wood, but we do not have the right to the rest of it. Our use of the path is regularly endangered by bikers and those who decide that it is far easier to dump their rubbish in the wood, rather than take it to the dump or use the skip.

Someone is dumping in the wood again and putting our use of it at risk, as the landlord will simply seek to close the wood for everyone. The people who are doing this know who they are. Perhaps it is time that the rest of us knew who is to blame for the desecration of a much valued, quiet recreation area for Birchanger.

It would be nice if the person who dumped the red flymo, could have the decency to remove it!

### What to do if there is a fire in your home.

The recent serious house fire in Birchanger has brought it home to everyone just how easily fires can start, and how incredibly quickly they spread. Fortunately in this case everyone escaped, but it could very easily, have been an even bigger tragedy.

Everyone, even from a very young age should at least know some very basic rules when fire starts. When a fire is discovered or a smoke alarm goes off, everybody in the house must be alerted and leave the house immediately. There may be some members of the household who would need help and other members must think ahead as to how they would do that if the worst was to happen. If doors are closed, check them first, with the back of your hand, to see if they are warm. If they are, do not open them. The fire is in there. If there is a lot of smoke, crawl along the ground with your nose near the floor, where the air will be cleaner. Don't stop, or go back for anything. Ask a neighbour to call the Fire Brigade. Make sure the address is clearly given.

It is possible that your only route will be through a window. If you need to break the glass, make sure you cover the jagged edges with towels or bedding. If your escape has to be from upstairs, throw some bedding out first, then lower yourself as far as possible with your arms. If your escape route is blocked, get everyone into the same room, seal the gap at the bottom of the door as much as possible with whatever soft fabric is available, and attempt to call for help from the window. Not a happy prospect for anyone to contemplate, but we have to be realistic, and it could happen to anyone at any time.

Smoke alarms give early warnings, and do save lives. Make sure you have them, and check the batteries regularly.

Birchanger cubs held their annual fun day at the end of June in the grounds of Birchanger Primary School, and a fun time was, appropriately, had by all!




