There were celebrations for pupils at the "Wendy Mitchell School of Dancing" in Birchanger and Stansted this term after they received excellent Ballet examination results. Several of the children received certificates for their original entries in the National "Cecchetti Choreographic Competition". Clare Agnew, Laura Warbrick, Beth Bashford-Chuchla and Lauren Wesley all won awards for their choreography and dancing.

Clare Agnew, Nikki Cooper and Lauren Wesley have been attending the London Arts Educational School, on Saturdays after Wendy Mitchell saw they had the potential to audition for places. At this professional School, pupils learn a wide range of dance styles including Modern , Jazz, Character and Tap dancing while developing their Ballet skills. Visits to the Theatre and the opportunity to watch Ballet company classes and rehearsals are also on the agenda.

Wendy Mitchell began her dancing at a local dancing school at the age of 3 years. She later attended the professional Arts Educational School where she learned the professional dance skills that helped her in the Theatre world which included a season with the Stuttgart Ballet Company before beginning her career as a Dance Teacher. While teaching at a private school, Wendy taught ballet and tap dancing to Lady Diana Spencer, an association that continued for a number of years. Wendy has been teaching dance in the Stansted and Bishops Stortford area for the past 27 years.

Future examinations for those at the "Wendy Mitchell School of Dance" are booked at St Mary's Church Hall Birchanger and St John's Church Hall Stansted and the pupils are looking forward to more successes. All the children will be working towards a Dance production to be performed later in 2005.

## PARISH COUNCIL NEWS FROM Elizabeth Godwin

#### The Church Hall is taking a bashing

Here is yet another complaint about the behaviour of our youngsters. It now seems some of them have taken to playing football on the flat piece of ground next to the Church Hall. Apparently the Recreation ground is just not good enough for them as the grass is too long and the end wall of the hall is a perfect place to kick a ball at.

While this sounds harmless enough it does not take into account the damage to the hall that is being caused. So far repairs to the guttering have cost over £70 and if the play there continues this will only rise.

While we appreciate that the Rec is not the Millennium Stadium you can kick a ball about there quite happily and no one will complain.

We are told that the players names are known and that means their parents are known as well. So parents please direct your footballing sons to the recreation ground. The Church hall is not the place for ball games.

## Concession cards for the Leisure centres

A new concession card can save some people up to £37 for regular use of the three local Leisure Centres. The nearest centre to us is at Stansted Mountfitchet High School, although the concession is equally valid in Helena Romanes and the Lord Butler Centre as well.

Those who are entitled to the concessionary rates include those on Income Based Job Seekers Allowance, Income Support, Working Tax Credit, Housing Benefit, and those who are registered disabled. ## Wake up call for Birchanger

The Judgement in the High Court Challenge left all options open regarding the site of the second runway. While it is quite likely that BAA may well return to the original option, it is also possible that they will consider a closer coupled runway, which could be less costly overall. This could have implications for Birchanger.

Takeley Parish Council is hoping for a hearing on their High Court Challenge on the unfairness of the HOSS scheme. This unfairness also affects Birchanger. It is possible that Birchanger might need to mount a challenge, or to join with other villages in a challenge in the foreseeable future. It may well be that we shall have to start to precept for this.

Should the new runway affect Birchanger in a larger way than we already experience, the Parish Council will want to know what you think. Going to court is not always the best way, but the recent challenge to the Government's White Paper, and the unprecedented outcome, has shown that local people can be heard, and that not even governments are above the law.

## Nobody anywhere has the right to dump!

Unfortunately there seem to be some incredibly lazy people who believe that the fields which surround Birchanger are just the place to dump their rubbish. They do not care that it makes it extremely unpleasant for those who walk the footpaths. They do not care about those whose land is crossed by the parade of wheelbarrows which are used to dump the hardcore, gardening and household rubbish which they are too indolent to take to the tip. They do not care that it costs the farmers who farm the land hard cash to have the rubbish removed.

It is an offence to dump anything anywhere except in the proper place. Unauthorised filling of ditches with hard core, as has happened, can result in flooding, and compounds the offence. The penalties are not light. Over 1000 people in Birchanger respect the countryside, and do not wish to cause problems for their neighbours, or the environment. It is only the incredibly selfish and lazy few. It is hoped that an addition to the Anti Social Behaviour laws planned for later this year, will give Parish Councils the power to issue Anti Social Behaviour Orders to these people. #### Footpaths being misused

There are months when it seems that there is nothing but complaints about the way in which a tiny minority make life difficult for everyone in the village. It is something of an annual one this time, as just at the time when people are looking forward to using the footpaths again, they find they are unusable. If it is not the bike riders, it is some members of the horse riding community, who have made the footpaths impossible. There are three bridleways through the village for horses, one from Birchanger Wood, the other going towards Digby Wood, and the third passing Spider Cottage towards the motorway. These are clearly signed. Everything else is strictly off limits, and riders are facing a fine if they use the footpaths.

## Do you want to stop smoking?

Many people try at least once a year to stop smoking, only to relapse when the pressure is on. Some have tried numerous expensive remedies, all are aware that they are damaging their health.


## Concessionary bus fares scheme 2005/2006

If you are registered blind, or disabled, or over 60 years old, you are eligible to apply for a half fare bus pass, or £30 worth of National Tokens for £15. Application Forms and bus passes will be available from Post Offices throughout the district, except in Dunmow, or Saffron Walden, where they will be available from the Council Offices. If you are applying for a bus pass for the first time, a photograph is also required. The new bus pass scheme will not operate until 2006, and then will have severe limitations.

## RAY GOODING STANDS FOR THE ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

Birchanger villager Ray Gooding, who has lived in the Village since 1999, is standing in the elections on May 5<sup>th</sup> and is hoping to become the County Councillor for the Stansted Division, which includes Birchanger.

Ray believes that the local area has a unique geographic and economic diversity and that the threat of extensive building, the airport and the attendant growth in traffic will, unless properly managed, become a blight on the lives of the residents. The area deserves the strongest representation at County level.

Ray is representing the Conservative Party at the election and is seeking to continue the success they have enjoyed in Essex since they took control in 2001 and on the specific issues affecting Birchanger he has said the following: -

**Housing.** The extent of housing development proposed for the M11 Corridor is unnecessary, unsustainable and a potential environmental disaster. Ray will fight to restrict unwarranted urbanisation.

**Stansted Airport.** Ray strongly supports the campaign to restrict airport expansion whilst understanding the need to provide sources of employment within the area.

**Transport.** The last budget prepared by the Conservatives at Essex County Council has pledged to develop Rail, Bus and road links and has increased the funding for repairs to both major and secondary roads. Ray supports this policy in full.

If elected, he is looking forward to the chance to represent the requirements of the area at the County Council.
