### A real local hero

Birchanger suffers from overgrown footpaths and bridle ways which are impossible to use without being stung to pieces. It seems we are the last to have our footpaths trimmed, situated as it were on the outpost of the county.

Every year the Parish Council along with many others complain to Robin Wallbank at Essex County Council Footpaths, to no avail.

One man has had enough of this and not for the first time, has taken matters into his own hands and trimmed the bridleway which goes to the bridge over the M11.

It is hard work and the chances of getting stung by the nettles 100%, but without even being asked, he has trimmed the bridleway. This means that walkers can now use this path again.

Everyone who uses the path regularly appreciates all that **Chris Emery** has done to make the path usable again. A job much appreciated but one that should never have been needed to be done by a member of the public. No doubt spending cuts mean staff reductions, but why is it always this village who comes last? A big thank you Chris from us all.

### Could you benefit from this charity?

You may be totally unaware that there is a small charity which aims to provide some small help to those suffering from a long term condition, who might just need something which would help to make their lives a little easier, but which is beyond their own budget.

The Charity is known as the Stansted and Birchanger Relief in Sickness Charity and some people in Birchanger have benefited from this in years gone by.

The problem is that the trustees often do not know who would benefit from this, or where the special needs are. They rely on people to tell them, as those in need rarely ask.

### Might these helicopters make us fat?

A recent study published by the Lancet indicates that noise at 58 decibels and above could actually be causing us stress. This means that those who live near motorways and airports are particularly at risk. In Birchanger we have both these situations so are doubly at risk it seems.

The science behind all this is that exposure to noises 58 decibels and above for long term periods can, unbeknown to us be causing us stress. When exposed to stress for prolonged periods, the body goes into fight or flight mode. In preparing itself for a perceived disaster the system which controls our appetites goes into overdrive in expectation of some kind of cataclysmic event. It actually releases hormones which make us eat more.

The phenomenon is observed on certain roads in London, Buckingham Palace is one area where noise levels of 75 decibels are recorded as it is also in Tottenham Court Road. Gatwick is another place where recorded decibels hit the 75 level. Waist measurements in these places, are noticeably higher proportionately and they do not think it is because of the large number of fast food shops in these areas either!

Clearly more work needs to be done, but this is the first hint that noise can actually be physically as well as mentally damaging.

I do not yet feel, that there is enough known for me to complain to, the airport that they have made my trousers too tight, but I do think that this is something to watch for in the future.

# Our health depends on where we live in Uttlesford

It is perhaps not surprising that good health is directly related to levels of deprivation. Birchanger is situated in the second best of the areas in Uttlesford. Our health rating and life expectancy is therefore, according to the statistics, better than most in the district. Men can expect to live until 85, women have one more year. Early deaths are classified as those before 75, and for both sexes, deaths from cancer, heart disease and stroke are fewer in the least deprived areas.

The issues of concern in Uttlesford are the high number of hip fractures and road deaths. We do have the M11 through our district, which contributes to the road death

total. We also have too many smokers, too many obese residents, too many cases of malignant melanomas, too many deaths in winter and our infant mortality rate could be improved. In short, we have to take more care on the roads, stay out of the sun, and look after our older people in winter time.

The good news is that we have fewer over weight children, fewer children in poverty and are quite good at being physically active.

### Uttlesford transport needs volunteers

Uttlesford Transport is a success story, but it does depend on the help of volunteers. Based in Dunmow's Flitch industrial estate, and with parking available, the charity is looking for more volunteers to drive hospital cars, minibus drivers, office volunteers and trustees. The work is enjoyable and rewarding. You are helping people who have no other form of transport to have mobility at a price which they can afford.

If you could spare a few hours a week and would like to know more about the volunteering opportunities available, please call 01371 875787. You will meet a great variety of interesting people and as well as the hospital run, visit some interesting places in your work.

### GP Surgeries open 7 days per week?

There are plans to open surgeries 7 days a week in some areas of West Essex. It will not be across the board, it could be your surgery but there is no guarantee yet. Things are set to get better overall, so if not now, it could be soon.

In another initiative more weekend staff have been recruited to work in hospitals at weekends This is primarily to speed up discharge, so that those who find they are in hospital on a Friday, need not face the prospect of a weekend in hospital. This new team can send you home, hopefully with care arranged and the right medicine.

This should in turn, free up beds for those who have to be admitted at the weekend.

Things may well be getting better in the health services?

# The integrated health care plan on trial

It sounds like a dream, but integrated health care is being trialled in the North of Uttlesford. The trial will last for 100 days and will try to co-ordinate all the medical and social care needs of elderly patients only at this stage. It is a big ask, but it would be great not to have to keep repeating the details of our medication and illnesses to every different doctor whom we come across on our hospital stays and visits.

To discover that Social Services actually do know about us, and what our needs are, without us having to explain them over and over again, would be a bonus.

To have our prescriptions renewed regularly, to meet nursing staff who understand our condition and know what our care plan is, without us giving endless explanations, must cut down the time needed for our treatment.

Five lucky areas are trialing the new integrated care for different specialities of the NHS. For North Uttlesford it will be integrated care for older patients. If it works, the rest of us may get it next summer for all areas of treatment.

### Vineyards in Birchanger?

Some years ago Birchanger residents tried to grow their own grapes. Mostly they succeeded, but the grapes were often very small although they tasted very good. Perhaps they were better suited to wine?

There are many successful wine growers in the south of the country and their wines are getting better all the time. The most delicious one I have tasted recently has been the one from New Hall at Purleigh in Essex, sold under the label New Hall. There are sparkling varieties also on offer.

These wines all benefit from keeping a little while. They are mainly white with some well balanced reds from Sussex. Has anyone tried English wine recently? What was your opinion? Would you repeat the experience?

### Bonfire nuisance

Bonfires can be fun, sometimes necessary, but can also be a menace for your neighbours. There seem to have been a great many bonfires in Birchanger in the last few weeks, in daylight hours, which have given their unwelcome smell to homes and washing alike.

Birchanger is not a smokeless zone, but if a bonfire blows smoke over other people's houses and causes a nuisance, you can quite legitimately be asked to put it out.

A call to public health can mean a visit from an official who can actually make you put it out.

Funnily enough, nobody complains about winter bonfires after dark, so leave your bonfire until November and there should not be a problem.


